
This motorhome has some amazing features like hot water shower, big water tank and solar system which allows you to enjoy nature and still have comfortable bed, and proper dinner.



# COCKPIT

#### Driving position

On the bottom of the driver's seat, you will find 2 leversto regulate seating position.

Adjust distance from steering wheel, reclining level and lumbar support.

#### Privacy Covers

You can cover from window screen for more privacy inside. Covers are located behind the passenger seat, and they clip on magnets along the window. Black side should be facing inside.

#### Gps

Mercedes is equipped with Gps navigation system and owners can locate Campervan anytime and also remotely unlock doors in case of emergency.

#### Swivel seat

Pull up on lever on bottom of the seat. This will release the swivel mechanism. And allow the chair to move, the chair will lock into place at 180 degrees turned all the way.

#### Tool box

Over seat there is a tool box with miscellaneous like duck-tape, flashlight, tools, emergency road kit is located in garage under bed.

# HOUSE RULES

1

#### NO SMOKING

Smoking inside the camper is strictly prohibited. A smoke detector is installed.

2

#### **FUEL DIESEL #2 ONLY**

No biodiesel no diesel #1

3

#### DRIVING SAFETY

Make sure all loose things are secured and do not leave them on countertops. Do not pack any heavy items into overhead compartments.

4

#### **KEEPING IT TIDY**

Don't wear shoes inside and keep it tidy. Flush only RF SAFE toilet paper.

5

#### REPORTING DAMAGE

Things happen, and we totally get it, but we ask you to report any damages and/or breakages in a reasonably timely manner.

6

#### NO OFFROAD AND NO FESTIVALS



#### TOILET

Lightly press the button to release water into the bowl of the toilet.

Moving lever to right side will open the base of the toilet bowl and release the contents into the black tank.

USE ONLY RV TOILET PAPER - WE PROVIDE IT.



#### WATER USE

Our fresh water tank has 21gallons, so it's not to big for a camper, but still you have to be very conscious about your water use when you don't have a water supply. To give you an idea, one shower at home a 10-minute shower would use somewhere close to 25 gallons.

THINK FIRST THEN RUN THE TAB.




#### **BEDS**

There are 2 sleeping places in the RV. Single master foam mattress is no doubt the most comfortable option. Second best would be a luna bed. To assemble, install luna bed on top of front seats .



## ELECTRICAL SYSTEM



#### How to control the system with the touchscreen

The best way to use the Timberline system is to enable the burner, the electrical element, and the hot water icon. The Timberline system will self manage, prioritizing the element if the coach is plugged in and only using the diesel/gas burner as needed. When its cold outside, set the thermostat to your desired temperature and the system will manage energy while maintaining the selected set point. If you are utilizing multiple 120V appliances at the same time (Coffee maker, AC, etc) you can turn off the electric element to conserve amperage and the Timberline system will maintain hot water and heat via the diesel burner. If you want to conserve diesel you can choose only the electric element. Note: The electric element is limited in energy and will not provide as much hot water or keep the coach warm in colder temperature

# KITCHEN

#### STOVE

Induction stove allows you to easily cook a proper dinner. To turn in on simply press and hold the power button and then choose temperature.



#### FRIDGE

The fridge with freezer compartment will allow you to stock up on some fresh produce and stay off-grid longer. To make it more efficient, don't put any warm produce inside.



#### SINK

Stainless steel sink with single lever faucet and pullout sprayer.



#### BBQ (Optional)

Cooking outside is the best part of any RV trip. In the rear storage you will find gas grill and gas bottle, so you can enjoy some BBQ deliciousness. Please clean the grill after use.

# DEPARTURE CHECKLIST

Retract the awning and lower the antenna completely.

Put away any loose items, lock all the cabinets doors. Put down toilet seat and lid. Close all the windows and vents.

Turn off all the lights and the AC/heater and water heater

Disconnect all the hookups (water, electricity, sewage) and remove leveling equipment.

Release emergency break, put Tow Mode on and hit the road!

# ETTING UP A CAMP

#### **CHOOSE RIGHT SPOT**

Look for the spot that will fit a 30' vehicle. Preferably use spotter outside. Check the surrounding first!

Try to choose level spot. Use leveling blocks when necessary. They are stored in the rear storage.

Turn off the engine and engage the parking brake.

#### **CONNECTIONS**

Before plugin in, turn off the breakers. Connect 30AMP cord (it is stored in side compartment) and turn breakers on. If the place is 50AMP, you can connect only with adapter.

Connect your water hose to the spigot and the hose to your RV's city water inlet on the side. Open spigot.

#### **EXTRAS**

Put on cab window cover and lock the cab doors.

Put awning out using switch located next to sliding door on cabinet. Do not use it when windy and don't leave it through the night.




## Waste dumping

### WEBSITE TO LOCATE DUMP STATION ARE sanidumps.com AND RVdumps.com YOU CAN ALSO USE APP iOverlander and Campendium

The freshwater tank holds your clean water.

This is the RV water tank that supplies water to your RV sink and shower.



The gray water tank holds the dirty water from your shower and sinks.

The RV black water tank contains wastewater and sewage from your RV toilet.

## DUMP WHEN TANKS ARE 3/4 FULL OR AT THE END OF A TRIP. FIRST BLACK TANK THEN GREY ONE - ALWAYS!

- 1. Park near sewer drain. Close the RV's windows and vents to keep noxious smells and fumes outdoors
- 2. Secure the L shaped end of the hose to the valve at the sewer line or dumping station. Next, hook up hose to the black tank valve on the side of the RV.
- 3. Pull the black water tank valve handle located next to sewer hose connection to empty the toilet waste first. Allow it to drain completely. Close the black tang valve.
- 4. Repeat for the gray water tank.
- 5. Disconnect hose from RV, lift it to drain any remaining water into the dump inlet and rinse by connecting to the dump station's water supply NEVER USE RV FRESH WATER!

NEVER PUT ANYTHING IN THE BLACK WATER TANK OTHER THAN BIODEGRADABLE RV TOILET PAPER. ALSO, DON'T BE PUTTING ANY FOOD IN THE KITCHEN SINK! REMEMBER, THE GRAY HOLDING TANK SYSTEM CAN GET CLOGGED TOO!

# ADDITIONAL INFO

#### How to travel safely with your RV

Perform walk-around visual inspection before embarking on trip. A pre-trip checklist should include things like

- Retract awnings
- look under rig for signs of fluid leaks
- Release parking brake
- Inspect tires
- Disconnect all water and sewer lines
- Check your surroundings (weather, overhangs and ground hazards)

#### Practice SAFE cornering

 Slowly approach the turn. It's much easier to maneuver a corner with a lover speed.

#### Know your height

• Winnebago Revel height is 9'11"

#### Avoid unexpected blowouts

 Watch your tire pressure. Booth under and over inflation can lead to blowouts. To help prevent this, check your tire pressure before you start your trip. You can access tire pressure on driver display.

# EMERGENCY PROCEDURES

#### BREAKDOWN

- Pull over to safe location and turn on Hazard lights.
- Assess the situation and call roadside assistance if necessary

#### FIRE

- If fire occurs, immediately turn off all appliances and exit the vehicle
- Use the fire extinguisher if safe to do so, otherwise move to a safe distance and call emergency sevices
   911

#### **ACCIDENT**

- Ensure everyone is safe and call 911
- Document the accident with photos exchange information with other driver and collect wittness statements and information (insurance and ID)

- Empty black and gray water tanks.
- fill water tank.
- Take all of your belongings from rear storage.
- Clean grill (if used).
- Fill fuel tank DIESEL #2 ONLY
- Fill DEF


